Service to their communities and departments.





After experimenting with many homemade remedies and store-bought products, she founded her own business. By early 1910, Madame Walker had settled in Indian-



Lions Operation Friendship - Ensenada, B.C., Mexico

Lion Verdie Thompson Region 2 Zone1 Chair participated in the 4AC District Lions visitation to the Ensenada Lions and medical mission on March 27-30, 2008, Operation Friendship: Hands Across the Board. This was the

45th venture. The following information was obtained from an interview with Lion Benjamin Fregoso, Parlier Lions Club. Ben is one of 8 committee members. Lion Bill Diltz is the committee chair.

How did this mission begin?

It started 45 years ago, when member of the Three Rivers Lions Club members where in Ensenada Mexico working and then happen to go into a saloon where they saw a Lions Logo sign hanging on the wall. One member of the Three Rivers Lions Club said out loud, "who in the hell is a Lion here?" and then the owner and operator (Carlos Avila) said, "who in the hell wants to know?" and that is where all this started. They formed an alliance to start the project "Hands across the borders", and then changed its name to Operation Friendship.

How many clubs are involved currently?

There are about 22 to 25 clubs on average that really get involved in making this visitation a great success.

What were the statistics for this past visitation?

In the eye clinic, about 180 children and adults where checked on by Dr. Lion Jeff Garcia, and about 86 pairs of

glasses where given out to very needy individuals. Lion Sofia Aguilar (Hygienist) said about the same amount of patients were seen within a 3-hour window once we were set up.


Any other ideas, thoughts about the mission and how it connects Lions to the community?

The Lions clubs that go raise money to donate to the building fund that will continue to build new schools in areas out side the city that is in need of it or for the infrastructure of existing school sites for improvements. Most of the funding that is raised is by ticket sales, by Lion Clubs, or personal donations. None of these funds can be used other than for construction purposes. Lions club also donate bulk school supplies to help the various school sites that are now in existence, "Operation Friendship", has a total of 16 school sites that have been built since its beginning stage.

After all of the clinics have been completed, Lion Members bring small items to give to the children, such as pencils, erasers, coloring books, crayons, stickers, raisins, candy, etc....

This trip was a great success and we hope all of you will join us on our next annual "Operation Friendship", March 19-22, 2009.


