District 4-C4 Tree Planting Committee, of which Lion Macy and I are both members of, was happy to report that it has exceed the original District goal of 1000 tree and instead 16,000 trees and counting will be planted by the end of the program in a couple of months. There were a total of 15 Lions Club in the District which participated in the program and we are looking for 5 more Clubs as my Foundation - Legacy Through Giving - also donated \$300 to take part in this program.

The original maple tree used by IP Tam to launch the Tree Planting Program in the US was auctioned off and won by Lion Michael Chan and later donated to the District for IP Tam's dedication. It was not planted but instead a Magnolia tree was

planted at the St. Mary Square. The maple tree will be taken back to be planted in a San Mateo location, home of the San Mateo Lions Club. It was a wonderful day for the tree ceremony and the IDs enjoyed the walk along Grant Avenue to E.of China.
