Spotlight: San Bruno Lion Frank Rescino

My name is Captain Frank Rescino. I am a third generation San Francisco Italian fisherman. My grandfather came from Italy in 1908. He worked on the sailing ship *Balclutha* (then known as the *Star of Alaska*) to make enough money to bring his wife from Italy. He had his first boat built at Fisherman's Wharf the year he arrived. My father also became a commercial salmon fisherman before changing to sport fishing in 1953 (the year I was born). He built his third boat, the *Lovely Martha* in 1959 and I began fishing with him at six years old before becoming a full deckhand at age ten. He was a founding participant in the SFPD Kid's Fishing Program when it started in 1968.

I got my captain's license in 1972 and have been taking the kids out ever since. The number of kids I have personally taken fishing, most often for the first time in their life is in the tens of thousands. I have mentored many current boat captains including Don Franklin, Joe Nazar and more.

Recently, my son became a fourth generation captain and looks forward to a long future with the Kid's Fishing Program as well. My two grandchildren also love to fish, and hopefully will become the fifth generation of Rescino fishing captains.

I am also very involved in the local community through several programs and associations in an executive role including the Golden Gate Fisherman's Association; I am on the Board of Governors of the Fisherman's Wharf Merchant's Association and past president of the San Bruno Lion's Club. I am also a founding member of the Lion's Club's Veteran's Fishing Program. I participate in a few other

groups including the Fisherman's Wharf Community Benefit District and the Pier Safe Group.

I have been involved with the San Francisco Police Kid's Fishing Program since I was a child; it is incredibly important to me and the other members of this organization that we see it growing to accommodate as many children as possible. The introduction to fishing that we provide to these kids may be the key to the future of the fishing industry here in Northern California.

TO SEEK success and to demand all fair remuneration of profit for my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down others. To be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as the right or ethics of my position of action towards my fellow man, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the true spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my unswerving loyalty in word, act as deed; to give them freely of my time, labor and means.

TO AID my fellow man by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

TO BE careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise. To build up and not destroy.

TO CREATE and foster a spirit of "GENEROUS CONSIDERATION" among the peoples of the world through a study of the problems of international relationship. **TO PROMOTE** the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship.

TO PROVIDE a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest, partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted.
