



Our District serves its community in a variety of ways: health fairs, pancake breakfasts, community festivals, summer concerts in the park, bingo and crab feeds, lobster feeds, tailgate parties, charity galas, supporting youth with scholarships and LYCA ticket sales, charity dances, international medical missions, and so much more.

Here is a preview of our District to give an idea of the amazing diversity of projects our clubs do in District 4C4. These clubs and all clubs will be asked to give a formal introduction in the coming months. We will also use info for our Club Pages on District Web Site. A Long Tail Ambassador and active Lion, here is a snapshot of what I've seen in our clubs throughout our District.

Palo Alto Host Lions Club, chartered on January 20, 1927. For many years, this club did a Concourse De' Elegance car show at Stanford University that raised tens of thousands of dollars for charity. One current event they do that's cool is their annual Big Game Luncheon with the Berkeley Lions Club during the month of the Big Game between Cal and Stanford. Lions from both clubs wear their team's jersey and sing fight songs and make rivalry chants and jokes. The clubs take turns hosting each year.

Millbrae Lions Club chartered on January 4, 1938. This club has a variety of projects they do for the community, including serving at a city wide car show and having two crab feeds. They are also strong supporters of youth programs in Millbrae.

SF Chinatown Lions Club chartered on May 14, 1952. One key project the club does each year is the annual Teen Chinatown Charity Gala. It raises over \$40,000 for scholarships & charities and challenges contestants to perform in talent, evening dress, and essay / speech. The event features over 300 in attendance and has community leaders among its judges.

Menlo Park Live Oak Lions Club chartered on February 26, 1962. At one time during their history, they split into two clubs and carried on for many years as two separate clubs, Menlo Park and Menlo Park Live Oak. A few years ago, they reunited as one. The club has been managing a community farmer's market every Sunday for 24 years and has raised over \$700,000 after expenses for Lions community giving and Lions programs.

SF Aeta Lions Club chartered on November 10, 2015. They were sponsored by SF Premier Lions Club. The club serves the Aeta Tribe in the Philippines and the Aeta Foundation stateside. At their installation they talked about a water well project that they were doing for the Aeta tribe in the Philippines, where the town water system was contaminated by a volcano. Recently, president Fernando Briosos was featured in a Philippine news site, showing photos of their service to the Aeta people. Millbrae Lions Club chartered on January 4, 1938. This club has a variety of projects they do for the community, including serving at a city wide car show and having two crab feeds. They are also strong supporters of youth programs.

Belmont Lions Club was chartered on December 11, 2006. They were sponsored by San Carlos Lions Club. One of their key projects is serving at the Save the Music festival and they offer a talent show for kids to compete. The festival is designed to raise money to save music programs in high schools from closure due to lack of funding.

Brisbane Lions Club was chartered on July 6, 1948. A strong presence in serving their community, one key project this club does is provide over \$30,000 in scholarships to worthy students.

Foster City Lions Club was chartered on January 24, 1967. For a few years, they were our largest club. This club has many members with over 15 years of Lions experience. They do 65 events a year and offered a fundraiser to save the Fireworks Show in Foster City when a budget shortfall during the Great Recession threatened to close the program. Annually, they raise over \$5000 providing parking support for attendees to the show. They also serve all day during the fireworks show, selling food and providing crafts programs for kids.

Half Moon Bay Lions Club was chartered on January 16, 1947. Their biggest event is serving the Half Moon Bay Festival each October. They also have a Sportsmen Dinner event featuring a diverse menu of wild game with Budweiser models present at event.

San Francisco Host Lions Club chartered on March 30, 1920. The club serves a diverse number of health fairs in San Francisco. They are our oldest club.

San Francisco Premier Lions Club chartered on April 3, 2006. They were sponsored by SSF Golden Gate Lions Club. They serve at a lot of health fairs and do international medical missions and a few special community projects in the Philippines.

San Mateo Lions Club is the third San Mateo Lions club in San Mateo. There were 2 others but there's only 1 now. On March 15, 2004, the current San Mateo Lions Club was chartered. The club has grown and retracted over the years, currently sitting at 16 regular members and 8 associate members. They have two Leos clubs: San Mateo Aragon High School Leos Club and San Mateo High School Leos Club. Signature projects include an annual Bowling for Kids Tournament to collect toys for underprivileged kids for Christmas; Bingo Feeds to support Lions Veterans Charities and Youth & Community Activities: MId-Peninsula Boys & Girls Club Movie Night, Rebuilding Together with Foster City Lions Club; Multi-Club Holiday party with Menlo Park Live Oak, Belmont, and San Carlos LCs; Senior Health Fair; Mid-Peninsula Boys & Girls Club Movie Night; Second Harvest Food Bank Warehouse Food Sort: Samaritan House Deliveries to Shut-Ins: San Mateo Wine Walk; Restaurant Walk Downtown San Mateo with Peninsula Special Interest LC; Rebuilding Together with Foster City; Pancake Breakfast for San Mateo Little League; District programs - Kases for Kids, Lions Veterans Charities, LYCA tickets, and others. We serve San Mateo. During our 12 years of existence, we also had routine service projects at Maple Street, Lions of Life, Campus Sightfirst, City of Hope, White Cane, and Eyeglass Collections. Awarded District Top Club in 2012-13 and Best Service Organization by Mid-Peninsula Boys & Girls Club in 2011, and honored in other Lions causes over the years.

Silicon Valley Cyber Lions Club was chartered on January 1, 2016, as our District's first cyber club. It is a special interest club, focused on serving the International community. Planned projects of the club include Sight Programs for Blind between US & China, Worldwide Sunny Smile web program for disabled children, Kases for Kids, Lions of Life, and more.
