My Fellow Lions,

Many of you might remember Andy Rooney, the curmudgeonly commentator from "60 Minutes" from years past. (If you remember James Kirkpatrick and Shana Alexander (Point/Counterpoint) then you're really showing your age!) Many were the Sunday evenings that I would enjoy watching Andy philosophize and expound on his life observations.

Often, in Lionism and in life, there are times when we are convinced that our viewpoint is the correct one, that I am right and he is wrong; that I was wronged and I have good reason to be offended.

And you may be right.

It is only human nature to carry some resentment and vent against a transgressor; to punish and want to get even. This, I understand as I have

done this many times myself.

The other night, I arrived a few minutes early for my club's general membership meeting, at the tail end of the board meeting. I walked into a heated discussion where various members of our board were arguing vehemently and were clearly at odds with each other. I was both pleased and proud to see that just a few minutes later, at the end of the meeting, these same members were laughing and joking as usual during the general meeting, having put their differences aside, as though the argument had never happened.

At the end of the day, we are all Lions. We come together to serve, not for selfish reasons.

Yet, there are times when the affront may be of a more personal nature, not simply a difference of opinion. I would ask you to remember that we are all human and apt to make mistakes. I think we have all done or said things that we would later regret and the words, "I'm sorry" are the hardest ones of all.

I feel bad and sorry when I see that two people that I like are angry with each other because I see the good qualities in each of them. This is especially true in our Lions world where I know that our members are all decent, kind and giving individuals.

A person can have a bad day which can culminate in a bad moment in which they say or do something that they otherwise wouldn't mean. One bad moment doesn't make someone a bad person. I would ask all our Lion members to remember the virtue of forgiveness. If someone repeatedly hurts or offends you, that's another thing. They say that it's easy to love your friends. An even greater reward is for those who can love those who have hurt them.

Sometimes it's not easy to forgive. It's not easy to turn the other cheek. There are many paths up Jacob's Ladder. You may be right but, please, be kind to each other.

The California Lions Foundation (CLF) has gotten off to a great start with a number of individual Lions and clubs indicating interest in contributing to CLF as Founding Members and Founding Clubs. To date CLF has raised approximately \$45,000 with a goal of \$250,000 by the end of 2017 at which time we will have a sufficient corpus from which to start making grants. At the recent MD4 convention, we presented 10 Kay K. Fukushima Fellows, including a special Fellow presentation by PID Larry Dicus to Denise Fukushima, Kay's widow. The Lions of California also presented convention guest, PIP Joe Preston, with a Fukushima Fellow.

We also held a board meeting and a planning session for the next six months at the MD4 convention during which we identified specific deliverables from each committee. CLF largely works through its seven committees composed of board members. These committees include: Fundraising & Recognition; Grants; Publicity; Budget, Finance & Investment Management; District Level; Policy, Strategic Planning, Bylaws & Legal; Executive. If you have interest in the District level, please let me

CLF now has a website at californialionsfoundation.org. Please take the time to look through it.

If you would like a presentation about CLF to your club or board of directors, please give me a call. In any event, please keep CLF in mind as you develop your charities budget for this upcoming fiscal year. It is an honor to be a Founding Member or Founding Club.

Here is a quick summary of how the California Lions Foundation will benefit your club:

- CLF is designed to complement grants already available from LCIF and other local foundations. CLF matching grants will be available in smaller dollar amounts, \$500-\$10,000, for projects that do not qualify for support from other foundations.
- CLF will be able to aid in disasters that are not "natural disasters." LCIF will provide support only to natural disasters.
- CLF can help if other grants are not available. CLF will provide matching grants from \$500 -\$10,000 with a streamlined review and approval process.
- CLF will seek donations from Corporations and Individual Sponsors, as well as local Lions.
- CLF offers special recognition for Club and Individual/Corporate donations as Founding Members.
- CLF ensures that donations are put to work to provide service to California communities.
- CLF will be available to partner with local Lions Clubs that do not have a 501(c)(3) designation.
   CLF will be available to accept donations from individuals, businesses or corporations that are meant for use by a Lions Club that does not have a 501(c)(3) designation. Any donation such as this will require prior approval by CLF.
- CLF will accept donations of stocks/bonds of publicly traded companies. This will allow for the
  donation of appreciated stocks and bonds whereby the donor receives a tax deduction for the
  full value of the donated item without having to pay any capital gains tax on the appreciated
  value
- CLF will accept donations of cars, boats and recreational vehicles.
- CLF will accept donations through Planned Giving such as a charitable remainder trust, charitable lead trust, real estate, and beneficiary designation from retirement plans and life insurance. Any proposed real estate donation must be reviewed by CLF prior to acceptance

We are off to a great start and look forward to a successful fundraising year so we can begin making grants to Lions clubs for the benefit of their communities.

Fellow Lions of MD4,

Your board of directors of the California Lions Foundation (CLF) is excited about the progress we have made since our approval as a 501(c)(3) corporation in mid-October. CLF can now accept donations that are tax deductible to the donor. To date we have received contributions from 25 individual Lions and clubs totaling over \$32,000. Donations can be in cash, stock in publicly traded companies, cars/boats/motor homes, and real estate (with prior approval).

The objective of CLF is to provide matching grants between \$500 and \$10,000 for Lions service projects in California. CLF will also accept donations for specified projects so long as the service project falls within the scope of CLF and is eligible to be treated as a tax deductible donation under IRC 501(c)(3).

CLF is not duplicating services or grants available from LCIF and other foundations or sources. Other foundations continue to be beneficial to Lions in service to their communities.

In order to begin assisting Lions clubs, we have established an initial funding goal of \$250,000. In order to meet this goal, CLF is providing an opportunity to California Lions and California Lions clubs to become 'Founding Members' and 'Founding Clubs' of the Foundation through calendar year 2017.

Lions may become a 'Founding Member' of CLF for a donation of \$1,000. In addition the member will also receive recognition as a 'Kay K. Fukushima Fellow'. A California Lions Club may become a 'Founding Club' of CLF for a donation of \$5,000. Founding member donations by individual Lions may be counted toward the 'Founding Club' donation amount to qualify as a 'Founding Club'.

Your CLF Board of Directors asks that each Lion, Lions club and District within MD4 consider the CLF
