1st Vice District
Governor Message

My Fellow Lions,

It's been a very busy month with planning meetings, District

Governor and campaign visits and, for the last two weeks, visits to other districts for their conventions. I had the pleasure two weeks ago to attend the District 4-A1 convention in Redding and then I went to the District 4-C5 convention in San Ramon this past weekend. I had a marvelous time at both conventions. I will say that one of my favorite aspects of being a VDG is being able to visit other districts and see what they do.

VDG Nick McNicholas (4-C5) and I were comparing notes and we both have observed that other districts may be very different in what they do and how they run their conventions and meetings but they are alike in a very important respect: their mission is to serve others. I continue to be impressed by the purity of heart in which our Lion members continue to serve, in other districts and in our own.

As we've approached our own district convention, Lions Cindy Smith, Helen Casaclang and I tried to visit as many clubs as we could. In some cases, we had to combine the campaign visits during a DG visitation due to the number of clubs that we now have in the district.

With this in mind, I would like to share with you some of my hopes for the district:

Membership will always be the utmost concern for any district governor because it is the members that perform the service. I will attempt to balance LCI's desire for new clubs while, at the same time, continue to support our existing clubs, many of which are struggling to attract and keep members. To this end, the week of our 1st Cabinet meeting in August, we will have an LCI membership specialist with us, both at the meeting and throughout the week. We hope to be able to convince members, especially those of struggling clubs, to take advantage of his time and learn strategies for bringing in members.

I would like the member clubs of the district to consider starting or placing renewed emphasis on cancer. LCI, in its new LCI Forward initiative, has identified pediatric cancer and diabetes as the major health risks of the next 50 years. I will encourage you to participate in programs like Relay for Life, Walk for

the Cure, Dime and a Prayer. Cancer is an insidious, dangerous disease which takes far too many innocent lives. Many believe that there is a cure. LCI and I would like to support this effort. This will be the focus at our 2nd Cabinet meeting in November.

If you looked at the contest rules which took effect April 1st, you might have noticed that there is a new club contest: Lions Against Hunger. We will be asking clubs to report their activities in the fight against hunger. Dollars raised and donated, food collected and donated, hours worked in a soup kitchen or preparing food packages will be among the ways you can help fight hunger. There can be nothing sadder than a child going to bed hungry or a parent not being able to feed his or her family. At the 3rd Cabinet meeting in February 2018, we will focus on the problem of hunger.

My fellow Lions, you serve with such passion and enthusiasm. Thank you always for the service you do.



District Highlights from International BOD Meeting in Greece, March 24-27, 2017...

- Revised Chapter XV of the Board Policy Manual to require prior authorization for the use of the association's trademarks by Lions in mobile applications.
- Revised the Club Excellence Award requirements and the District Excellence Award requirements to more closely support LCI Forward
- Revised board policy to require only one Guiding Lion on a new club application and encouraged any club that would benefit from having a Guiding Lion to request the assignment of a Guiding Lion
- Revised the Standard Form Club Constitution and By-Laws to introduce new club officer positions, expand the position of Club Vice President, and modernize the practices of Lions clubs
- Revised the Standard Form District By-Laws as it relates to the District Governor's Advisory Committee to include the Club Vice President and other club officers when appropriate
- ◆ Approved the Specialty Club Program to be implemented in the 2017-2018 fiscal year

Official Notice 2017 International Convention, Chicago, Illinois, USA

The following proposed amendments to the International By-Laws will be reported to the delegates for vote at the 2017 International Convention

ITEM 1: A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL
CALL PROVISION TO GIVE MORE
ADVANCED NOTICE OF THE CONVENTION
BY ALLOWING THE OFFICIAL CALL TO BE
ISSUED 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE
INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION, (THIS
AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES
A MAJORITY YOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE

BE IT RESOLVED, That, effective beginning with the 2017-2018 year, Article VI, Section 2 of the International By-Laws shall be amended by deleting the phrase "forty (40)" and replacing it with the phrase "sixty (60)".

ITEM 2: A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE BOARD REPRESENTATION PROVISION TO BE CONSISTENT WITH RECENT AMENDMENTS TO THE INTERNATIONAL CONSTITUTION. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAND THE BYLAND REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE

BE IT RESOLVED, That, effective beginning with the 2017-2018 year, Article II, Section 5 of the International By-Laws shall be amended by deleting the phrase "fourteen (14)" in line 3.

TIEM S: A RESOLUTION TO PERMIT AN INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR AND EXECUTIVE OFFICER FROM THE SAME DISTRICT TO SERVE ON THE INTERNATIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS SIMULTANEOUSLY, THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE: TO ADOUT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE

BE IT RESOLVED, That Article II, Section 5(c) of the International By-Laws be amended by deleting the phrase ", and a director".

ITEM #. A RESOLUTION TO CHANGE THE VALIDITY
PERIOD OF AN INTERNATIONAL OFFER
PROBLEMS THE WAS A STATEMENT OF A

BE IT RESOLVED, That Article II, Section 4(a), second paragraph of the International By-Laws be amended by changing the validity of an endorsement from two (2) to three (3) succeeding conventions by deleting the phrase "two (2)" and replacing it with the phrase "three (3)";

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Article II, Section 4 of the International By-Laws be amended by adding a new paragraph (c) as follows:

by adding a new paragraph (c) as tonioves:

Endormement for international director shall be valid for three (5) succeeding conventions provided that the candidate is otherwise eligible to be elected. If not elected during the initial endorsement, the candidate must three (3) years before such candidate is eligible to seek endorsement again. Endorsements shall be valid for three (3) succeeding conventions provided that the candidate is otherwise elligible to be elected for a maximum of two (2) succeeding succeeding conventions provided that the candidate is otherwise elligible to be elected for a maximum of two (2) succeeding succeeding conventions provided that the candidate is otherwise elligible to be candidate used to the control of the control of the candidate is elligible to seek endorsement again.


