



<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: Lion Ray Rosenthal reported that Mark Nakano will be inducted at tonight's meeting. Lion Ray also reported that a potential new member Nicolas Colombo contacted us through our website. Nicolas has attended orientation and is eager to become a member.

EASTER EGG HUNT: Lion Herb Perez announced that Gold Medal (his business) will hold an Easter Egg Hunt with activities for children and would like the Foster City Lions to co-sponsor the event at no cost. Tentative date: Easter Sunday,

March 31st, but flexible. Motion approved for the FC Lions Club to co-sponsor the Easter Egg Hunt and a committee will be formed to help Gold Medal organize the event.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING, CHARITIES, INC.

MINUTES APPROVED: 1/22/13 minutes approved.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Lion Martha reported that we received thank you's from Vista and LCIF for the \$1,000 donations.

TREASURER'S REPORT: none.

GENERAL DONATIONS: none.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS: Feb. 2nd - Lion Ed Flank reported that it went very well. They fed 125 athletes who were very appreciative. Lion Ed also suggested we look into the BBQ trailer which was borrowed from Burlingame Lions.

POLICE & FIRE BINGO: Feb. 1st – Lion Carolyn Cox reported that it was a great event. \$7,286.98 in total profits, of which will be divided in half between the

Lions and the Rotary. Each club will receive \$3,643.49. Each club will then give one-half each to the Police and Fire departments. Thus, we will give \$1,821.75 to the Police and the same amount to the Fire Departments.

HIT - A- THON: March 10th. Help is needed. Also need more young people to help. **CRAB FEED**: Almost at 100% sale of tickets, and most likely will be 100% by the date of event. We sold 26 tickets online, which is a good start for our first time selling tickets online. The Chamber of Commerce is bringing a lot of guests to the event. **AUDIT COMMITTEE**: Lion Ray Rosenthal reported that they had a difficult time going through records because Quickbooks was not used. The committee recommended that the Bylaws be amended to require an audit be done by the audit committee every year. Motion approved.

Recommendation from the Audit Committee to hire a bookkeeper to bring our books into Quickbooks because the spreadsheet is not enough. Lion Matt Crom explained Quickbooks is better because it provides significant details on the finances. Bookkeeper to train treasurers on use of Quickbooks. Recommendations tabled. **OLD BUSINESS:** None.

NEW BUSINESS:

Lion Shikha Hamilton reported that she met with the director of the Hillbarn Theatre Conservatory to discuss initial plans for a joint fundraiser to raise money for the arts for our four schools in Foster City and the three main high schools

(San Mateo, Hillsdale, Aragon). The plan is to do a talent show at the end of summer. Lion Shikha requested guidance from other Lions on how to move this idea forward. A motion was made and approved to all Lion Shikha to form an Arts Committee to explore this idea. Lions Ray Rosenthal and John Miller have joined the committee. Lion Shikha welcomes anyone else interested.

Lion Roger Chinn stated that it is time to re-open the Memorial Park discussion as they are getting closer to finding a site for a memorial for deceased FC Lions. Lion Ray Rosenthal reported that the Concourse D'Elegance is coming back and may be closer to us (possibly the fairgrounds), so we will be having further discussions.




