"The Newtown Lions Club has been shaken by the recent horrific events that have besieged our community. We ask that your thoughts and prayers are with the victims', families, our town, and country. We need to come together as a nation to address the deeper underlying societal challenges that affect us all. God Help Us and Bless Us.

According to the Associated Press, all six adults killed at the school were women. Of the 20 children who were shot to death, eight were boys and 12 were girls. All of the children were ages 6 or 7.



What is the Lions Cub Program and How Does it Work?


Lion Cubs are children of Lions club members in a Family Lions club.
