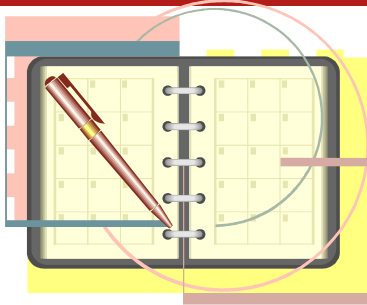

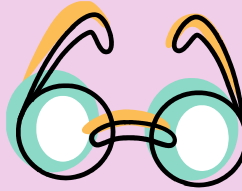
## SF The Castro: Project Homeless Connect

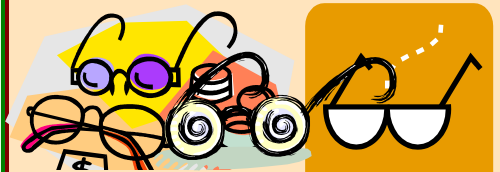

She spent several days of quality time with the School Staff, Community Advisory Board, students, parents and the general public. Her husband, Louis, and Highlands Founders, Lions Flor & Billy joined her. Because of Lion Lou's compassionate heart to serve the disadvantaged, she made a commitment to visit Pag-asa at least once a year. She said that running a school with an average of 55 students annually, is a huge task. Donating money is just a small part of it. She learned first-hand that ten {10} Highlands kindergarten graduates are the top ten {10} in Pag-asa's public school first-graders for the current year. This is a true measure of success thru the dedication and devotion of a professional staff team.

### USO Support Update

In less than a month (since the February 20 3rd District Assembly), our Lions have been fabulous; Lions Veterans Charities, Inc. (LVC) has received 13 lbs of coffee (Burlingame) plus a total of \$1,260; \$600 from 5 clubs (Atherton, Menlo Park Live Oak, San Mateo, Daly City Host and Menlo Park Host), \$260 from individuals (Garden Chapel, Lion Sam Lerner, Ms. Hong, Lion Marsha Kliever), plus \$400 - from \$50 LVC grants (one from each \$50 or more donation), with more to come! This generosity was in response to my announcement that

the USOs are once again running out of coffee. They serve 1600 to 2,500 military travelers (including kids) per month at SFO and more at Travis !

Thanks to your support we now have a program started for 2010. On March 18, we delivered \$600 of supplies for military, dependents and kids - including 108 lbs. coffee (+13 from Burlingame), 6 cases of soft drinks, 4 cases of juice, and much more. The coffee will last from 1 to 2 months, so we will restock in two months. At USO/Travis, they are going through the same critical situation and, with your help, we will try to do the same, at least with coffee. 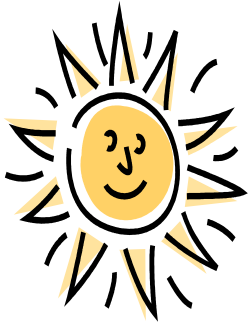
