FLAG DAY CELEBRATION: San Francisco Host Lions Club & Visitacion Valley Elementary School

"Give me liberty or give me death" (Patrick Henry, political leader during the American Revolution, 1736 - 1779) quoted by Gordon Mau--a 5th grade at Visitacion Valley Elementary School, to express what the American Flag means to him.

To promote observance of Flag Day, I met with Ms. Alene Wheaton (Principal), after the New Year. I

introduced myself as representative of San Francisco Host Lions Club and the reason of my visit; I briefed her about Lions Clubs International and the San Francisco

Host Lions Club--and most important--of the goals and objectives of the POSTER/ESSAY CONTEST/ FLAG CEREMONY on Flag Day. We set the day for February 11. I brought the winning entries from Flag Day, 2009, which served as perfect guidelines for the desired size of Poster and the accompanying Essay on "What The American Flag Means To Me."

On the 10th, I met with Mr. Jeffrey Hunter, a 2nd grade teacher-in-charge of the event and to coordinate with the rest of the faculty in the distribution of the 250 mini-American Flags to all of their students.

He coordinated as well, the Contest which was open only to 3rd to 5th grade students. There were 40+ entries! It was very refreshing reviewing the entries and left me extremely optimistic of the future of this, our U.S. of A.! Mr. Hunter and I picked the six

(6) winners. There before us--the poster of the American Flag and a short essay--are proof that the youth of today truly appreciate what the American Flag symbolizes; that they will abide by the truths, principles, values, and responsibilities it upholds.

The entire student body from K to 5th and their teachers, led by Ms. Wheaton, recited the Pledge Of Allegiance and sang "America, The Beautiful." The students had their right hand over their heart as they recited the Pledge; waved their flags proudly as they sang along.

PROJECT 1
Millbrae Community Youth Center
The site is a large Rig cabin type structure located on an elementary school campus in Millbrae.

Scope of work:

- Handicap ramp - wood or concrete yet to be determined based on donor participation
- Handrails for ramp
- Extensive prep and interior and exterior painting
- New interior lighting
- Adjust critical height to meet ADA requirements
- Saw cut concrete and move toilet to meet ADA requirements
- Install accessibility grab bars
- Floor cleaning and prep for carpet installation
- Installation of carpet tiles and rubber baseboard
- Seismic bracing

Materials needed:

- Ramp construction materials - either pressure treated for wood ramp or form materials for concrete ramp
- Concrete and rebar for ramp
- Handrails
- Interior lighting fixtures
- Raised planters and plant material for exterior entry area
- Grab bars for restrooms

YMCA Silicon Valley Domestic Violence Department
They provide a 24-hour toll-free helpline, crisis hotline, emergency shelter, crisis counseling, legal assistance, support groups, therapy, children's therapy, safety planning and community referrals to survivors of domestic violence. The site is a residential duplex.

The Scout House, built in 1954 by the Millbrae Lions Club, historically was the club's home base and venue for countless community events and activities. Since the late 90's the Millbrae School District, whose land is beneath the Scout House, dis-allowed further use of the property, in-turn boarding it up which attracted vandals and decay.

TO CREATE and foster a spirit of "GENEROUS CONSIDERATION" among the peoples of the world through a study of the problems of international relationship. **TO PROMOTE** the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship.

TO TAKE an active interest in the civic, social, and moral welfare of the community.

TO UNITE the members in the bonds of friendship and mutual understanding.

TO PROVIDE a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest,

partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted.

TO ENCOURAGE efficacy and promote high ethical standards and professions: provided that no club shall hold out as one of its objects financial benefits to its members.
