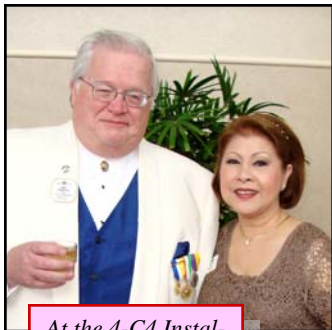

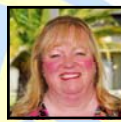

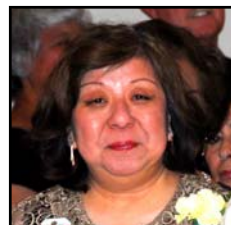

Suddenly-Paralyzed Teen grateful for Millbrae Lions Club donation

Mackenzie Williams started her freshman year at Mills High school like any other student -- well, not exactly like any other student. The tall and talented Mackenzie was an avid athlete and looked forward to four enjoyable years of basketball, volleyball and track. It was a shock when on Thanksgiving day in 2009 she started to feel some back pain, which, over the course of a few hours, rendered her paralyzed from the chest down. After two months in the hospital she was a paraplegic and there was still no good explanation for why it had happened.

One of Mackenzie's physical therapists told her about the Bay Area Outreach Program, a 501(c)3 working to improve the health, independence and social integration of people with physical disabilities through sports, fitness and recreation. After Mackenzie's first basketball practice even though her body was sore, she couldn't wait to go back. It wasn't long before she was on their varsity team.



Even after being in the hospital for so long Mackenzie finished her freshman year with a 4.0 GPA. BORP requires competitive athletes to maintain good grades to help with their future goals. There are not many wheelchair basketball teams so they need the athletes to fund travel expenses and if possible a custom fit basketball wheelchair. Mackenzie wrote to the Millbrae Lions and our

Board of Directors voted to donate \$1,000 to this inspiring young woman.

Mackenzie and her mother Kathleen attended our October 6th general meeting to meet our members and accept the donation. In the course of navigating the two wheelchair lifts down to the meeting room, the wheelchair took an unexpected lurch forward and Mackenzie ended up on the floor. I was more upset than Mackenzie. She positioned the chair, put the brakes on and pulled herself back up into the chair in less than 30 seconds. She explained to me that the rules of wheelchair basketball require that either alone or with the help of a team mate she must be able to get back into her own chair to continue the game. I can see that this young lady is well on her way to getting back into the Game of Life. And I think she'll be an All Star.

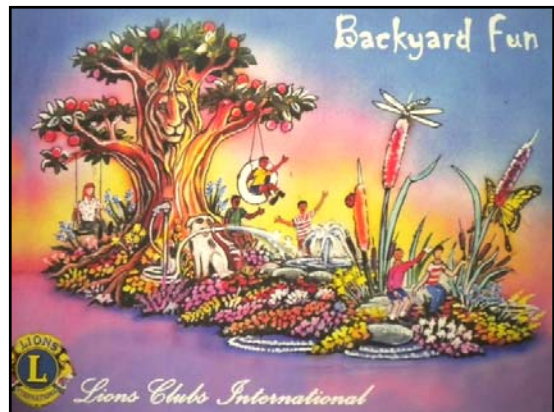
