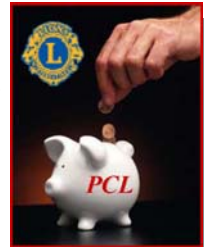


Fellow Lions:

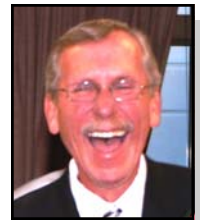

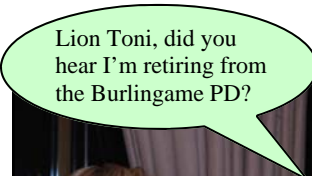

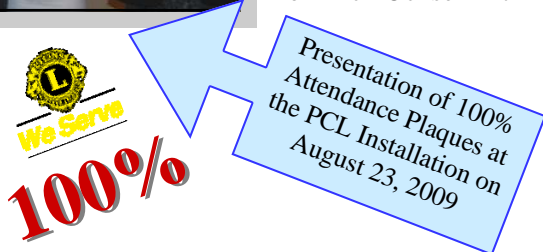

PCL meeting in honor of late Lion Paul Davis

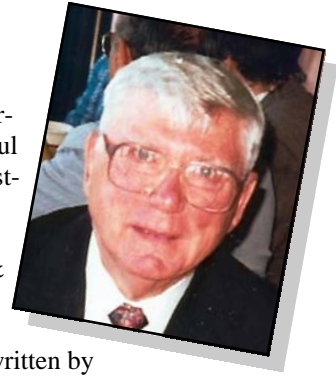
