help provide a student scholarship. Tickets sales raised \$3,536.50. The event involved 20 Lions volunteers over the 3-day event.

- Easter Egg Hunt and Pancake Breakfast, Saturday, April 7th. For the past 35 years, this has been one of the best-attended holiday events in Burlingame (anywhere from 1,500 to 2,000 attendees). It is held the day before Easter at the baseball field behind the Burlingame Lions Club Hall. About 500 pancake breakfasts are served with the income from the breakfasts being used to offset the cost of providing 4,000 chocolate Easter eggs made by Preston's Ice Cream and Candy to over 500 children of all ages. Entertainment is provided by the San Mateo Elks Club band and local artist and face painter, TwinkeeDeeStar, who does free face painting for the children. The event usually involves 20-30 Lions volunteers and 10-15 Leo Club volunteers. This event provides a wonderful opportunity for the community and great exposure for the Lions Club.
- Cinco de Mayo Bingo, Saturday, May 4th, 6pm, Lions Club Hall
- Cars-in-the-Park, Washington Park, July 28th, last Saturday in July. For the past 7 years, the Burlingame Lions Club has held a car show and BBQ in Washington Park. There have over 200 cars shown each year



with the average attendance between 2,000 and 3,000. Income is generated by entry fees, sponsorships and by food service. The event nets about \$6,000 and last year involved 26 Lions, 14 Leos, and 8 family members. Cars-in-the-Park is our largest fundraiser and it is truly an all-hands event.



ICDDR,B is the International Centre for Diarrheal Disease Research, Bangladesh - an international health research institution located in Dhaka Dr. Dover is remaking revisions the to the Nepal protocol and Dr. Sarker is making revisions to the Case Report Forms. Both Drs. Sarker and Pietroni volunteered to be co-investigators and schedule a visit to Nepal if that will help get the protocol approved.

- Production of Emergency Preparedness Video with Lion Jack Van Etten. Video outline drafted by Lion Jack for DG Esther and other's review. Taping plan to start in Feb. Please response to Jack's outline asap.

To Seek success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

To Remember that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

Lions International Purposes

To Organize, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.

To Coordinate the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.

To Create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.

To Promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.

To Take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

To Unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

To Provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

To Encourage service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.
