and every one of you for such a memorable year. From the bottom of my heart, thank you, thank you so much.

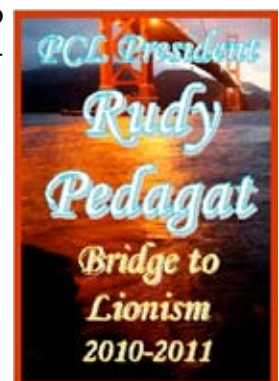

LVC still hard at work



Lions Veterans Charities Inc. again trucked a carload of supplies to the USO at SFO in June. This shipment represents over \$700 in needed supplies from drinks to snacks and serving supplies and will last only 2-3 months. We will then deliver another truckload of supplies. The local USOs receive 100% of their funding from local donations such as our local Lions Clubs. There is no financial assistance from our government or USO World Headquarters.

Our local Lions are also starting their annual fishing trips for the patients at the VA Hospital in Menlo Park. The first for the new fishing season will take place on July 20th, at which 20 patients will be going

on an all expenses paid, all day trip out of San Francisco's Fisherman's Wharf. With community support, the Lions hope to again take patients out 4 to 6 times this season and hope to expand these trips to the patients at the VA Hospital in Palo Alto.

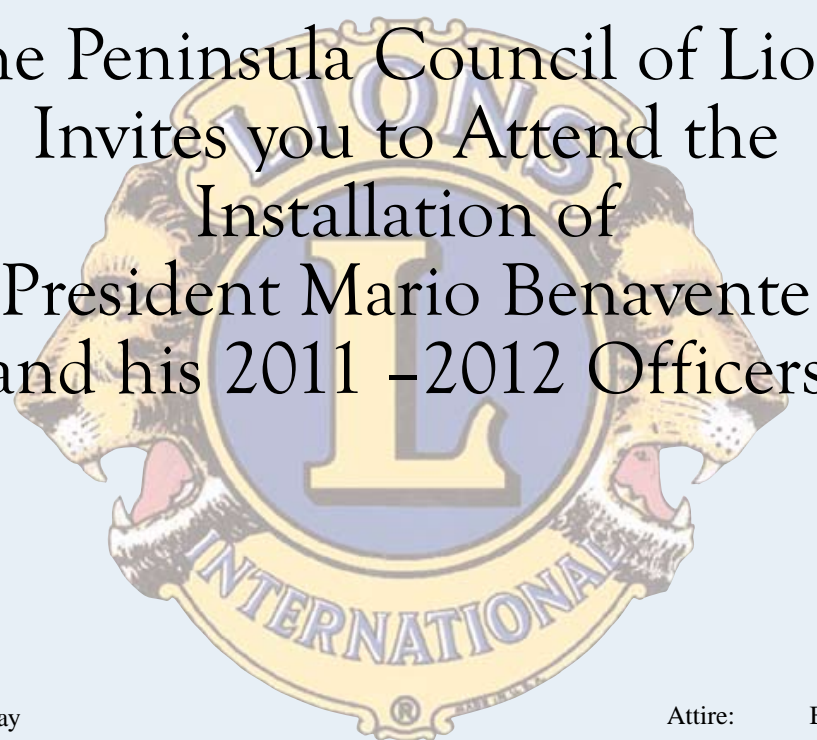

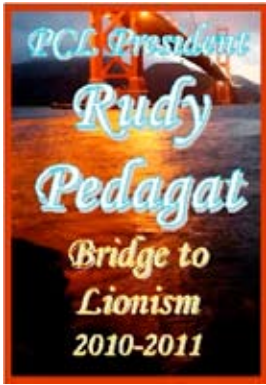

To Remember that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

Lions International Purposes

To Organize, charter and supervise service clubs to be known as Lions clubs.

To Coordinate the activities and standardize the administration of Lions clubs.

To Create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.

To Promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.

To Take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

To Unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

To Provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

To Encourage service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.
