

The upcoming project which will be a joint venture will be the Rebuilding Together home renovation for Viola Clay of East Palo alto with extensive exterior and interior work. East Palo Alto, Menlo Park Live Oaks, Menlo Park Host, Palo Alto Host and Redwood City Sunrise Lions have been invited to help. In addition to the Lions, the Law Office of Murray & Murray and Stanford Hospital and Clinics will be helping. So far, funding from Murray & Murray, Stanford Hospitals and clinics including the Lions is approximately \$7,000, which most will be used for building materials or replacement items within the home.

It is estimated that over 500 volunteer hours will be

needed to bring this home up to a better living standard. The homeowner and her daughter are both disabled and the home is in great disrepair. New carpeting has been donated and there will be many more items donated for this project. Because the work is extensive, pre-work will be accomplished during the latter part of March and all of April with the completion planned on April 30th. —Saturday, National Rebuilding Day. The Rebuilding Together Construction House Captain is Lion Jim Bigelow. Detailed work plans and budget are being worked on this week.

The home will need to be scraped to remove old paint which may have lead and requires special procedures, the home will need to be primed and painted on the exterior with carpentry work needed. Inside electrical work, plumbing, replacement of curtains which are currently in very bad condition. Repainting of the interior, work in the bathroom and kitchen will be required with some appliance replacement. Dead tree removal and new gutters and minor rood repair.

We continue to work with Menlo Park Live Oak on the Sunday Farmers market and provide needed excess produce to people in need through local non-profits. Eye exams and glasses including request for hearing aids continue.

Menlo Park Live Oaks received a second place award at the MD-4 Academy of Awards in Primm, Nevada at the recent conference. This project provides over \$30,000 for community giving and over \$50,000 in excess produce for the year round market.

Both Menlo Park Host and Live Oaks will be hosting guest from the Menlo Park Fire Protection District and the PCL Police and Firefighters banquet.

We will be donating eye glasses on March 26th.




If your club has members that require a special meal, please make sure that they are covered, and your special request form is submitted.

Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.
