The first meeting of the year got off to a late start. President Rudy wanted to give everyone a chance to get to the meeting. There were three auto accidents that blocked the main arteries into Foster City.



Foster City Lions President, Eleanor Lindquist, began the meeting by welcoming everyone to Foster City, and introducing our New PCL President Rudy Pedagat. He thanked everyone for attending, and was happy to see so many Lions

Clubs represented.

Lion Paul Larson, PCL 2nd VP, gave a brief update on the upcoming meetings. There will be a joint SF-CLC/PCL Halloween meeting on Wednesday, October 27. It is going to be held at the Elks Lodge in SSF. The food is going to be provided by the California Catering Company, so make sure you get your reservations in early. They really need a good head count for this event. It always a sell out, and well attended by both Councils. The cost is only \$25 per person.

The next PCL meeting is being hosted by the Can Carlos Lions Club and will take pace on Monday, November 22nd at the Iron Gate Restaurant.

Lion Dan Andersen, PCL Secretary/Bulletin Editor, asked all of the Club Presidents to make sure they sent him their monthly reports as part of an e-mail or in a MSWord document attached to the e-mail In that way he can make sure that all of the information from each club in attendance, and even those that could not make it, is included in the bulletin.

Special Report



PDG Lion Ken Ibarra gave an update on the fire at 6:15 p.m. in San Bruno on September 9th in the Glennview area.

There were 50 first responder agencies that came to the aid of San Bruno. The fire caused 368 residents to be evacuated. Only 320 have been able to return to their homes. There were 37 homes destroyed, and 20 more that are uninhabitable.

The City has arranged for 24/7 security for the area.

As of the meeting, PG&E has not determined that actual cause of the rupture and explosion. There is expected to be a full report within the next few months. Senator Jackie Speier has asked for tighter controls and oversight for the States, natural gas lines.

PDG Ken thanks the Millbrae Lions for their quick response to the disaster. They were actually ready to help by midnight, but were not able to get onto the Recreation Center site until the next morning, when they cooked for the evacuated residents, fire fighters, and response personnel.

Lions Clubs International President, Sid Scruggs, here for the Lions Eye Foundation dinner, was able to visit the Millbrae Club's emergency kitchen and see for himself what was happening.

LCIF issued a \$10,000 grant to be used by the San Bruno Lions Club, if needed. At this time it may not be needed. The various clubs and Lions have donated over \$35,000 to the disaster fund in San Bruno.

The San Bruno Lions have a donated warehouse that is going to be used to store cloths and other items for use by the victims. They are also looking for new or like-new furniture.

This was a wake-up call for the District. Lion Jack Van Etten and the District Governor are working on a District-wide disaster program.

To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.
