A message from your PCL President



Fellow Lions,
Since this is my first column as the president of the PCL, I'd like to start out by introducing myself. Lion Mario Benavente, 51 years old, married with 3 daughters, ages 9 to 18. I've been a member of the San Bruno Lions Club for a little over

ten years. My mother had been a Lioness, then, later a Lion but I had never given any thought to joining myself. I was busy with work, professional organizations, church and, of course, family obligations. The thought of becoming a Lion had never even crossed my mind.

A dentist by trade, I was working with a patient, a son of a Lion. What we were talking about, I don't remember but somehow the Lions Club came up. He wasn't trying to recruit me or anything. He wasn't even a Lion himself. But during the course of the conversation I realized that, yes, giving back to the community is something that I could do and I would be interested in doing that - someday. Someday came sooner than I thought.

A day later, I got a phone call from Alan Hafter, a fellow dentist in San Bruno and, as I discovered, a Lion. He invited me to a club meeting at the old Martinelli's. I only knew one or two people but everyone was friendly. It was student speaker night and I could see that they had many projects going on. After two more visits with the club, I was invited to join the club and I decided to become a Lion. Not long after, only a month or two,

I was put in charge of a Tex-Mex Night fundraising event. Once I had handled that, I was game for anything.

As it turned out, joining the San Bruno Lions would only be step one in my involvement with the Lions Club. As I became more involved with my new club and was asked to assume more responsibility, I learned that there were levels in this organization. I was asked to attend some meetings at something called the District and then the PCL.

At my first PCL meeting, I was convinced that I wouldn't be going back. I was standing around and I didn't know anybody. I was nursing a drink in one hand and trying to look involved but I was bored silly and looking to get out of there. Fortunately, I stuck around long enough to strike up a conversation with someone (maybe they struck one up with me) and I've never looked back. I've very much enjoyed my involvement with the San Bruno Lions Club, District 4-C4 and the PCL.

The point is this: 1) When you're out there in the world in your daily life, sprinkle a little Lions talk into your conversations. You don't know where a seed thrown may result in a new Lion. 2) Get your new members involved early. Once he or she has been deeply involved in a project, the new Lion is invested in your club. 3) If you see someone standing around and you don't know them, whether at your home club or at a District or PCL function, TALK TO THEM! You'll meet someone new and possibly get them cemented into Lionism. 4) Lions, get involved with your District and with the PCL. The nicest people I know are involved with this organization and if you restrict yourself to your home club, you're missing a tremendous benefit of being a Lion.




September 26, 2011 Dinner Meeting


First VP Report


the youth of our group purchasing popcorn. I invite all of you to participate and join me on this night.



To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To Aid others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To Be Careful with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.
