Peninsula Veterans Lions Club Report: President Edmund Bridges

Our Club has been hosting hospitalized Veterans to the Bay Area Association of Disabled Sailors program every Sunday at noon, In a partnership with BAADS, We are sponsoring a resource fair at Coast Guard Island on May 30, 2015 for the 2015 Valor Games, to over 100 physically disabled Veteran athletes and their families. We will be demonstrating the servo dinghy's that makes adaptive sailing a reality for these heroes. BAADS is now a recognized US Paralympic sponsored club, and we would like to bring our boat and safety infrastructure for use of the children involved with the Bay Area Special Olympics Lions Club, I have opened a dialogue with Lion Amy Fink to help this happen.

We have partnered with Menlo Park Presbyterian Church who has added \$1600 for our female Veterans inpatients, and are continuing our "Make-over Project," for our female Veterans to receive on a needs basis a gift certificate for a make-over at a local beauty salon. This has funded our ongoing project through the end of the year.

We have been able to, with many thanks to other Lions, and their respective clubs for the used household goods donated, to increase our "move-in" kits to our formerly homeless Veterans from 5 to 6 kits, There has been a big push from Washington to house up to 50 Veterans per month until the end of this year and any used kitchen or household items would be greatly appreciated. There is storage in Redwood City, and pickups can be arranged. I have a list of needed items.

We have reached out to an incoming student at Menlo Atherton HS, (Elise Kratzer) and are in the process of forming a Leo's club. We will be meeting with a faculty advisor soon.

We are sponsoring two bounce house for one of our community partners, the Menlo Park Homeowners group, for their annual "night out" event, in July. We will have an information table there, to thank them for their generous support of our annual V A hospital Christmas party. They have supported this event with catering, personalized and requested gifts for these Veterans for the last two years. We are very grateful to them, they have helped us raise over \$10,000 for this event.


