District Governor Lion Rod has committed our District to



presenting a party of a lifetime to celebrate 100 years of Lionism. The steering committee had debated often on venue and program, ultimately settling on our final

venue—SF Marriott Airport Hotel. The old venue of San Mateo Event Center had secondary costs that were just too high for the committee to keep that venue. DG Rod is committed to an attendance of 500-800, inviting nearby Districts C3 and C6 to participate. Cost is \$100 per person with negotiations underway to get parking comped and rooms at the hotel discounted for party attendees. Clubs can purchase a table at 10 per table for \$1000 and get a free display table, normally a \$200 fee if purchased separately. included for free. The tables are on a first come, first serve basis. Once sold out, buying a table won't get you a free display table. There are about 60 display tables, but keep in mind that two other Districts can buy them, too. Vendors can buy them, too. If interested, don't hesitate. Get your tickets bought and secure your display table. Deadline to buy tickets is February 28, 2017.

This event is ideal for new Lions and Clubs to come experience a lifetime of Lionism in our communities, get ideas for projects, and engage in fellowship with Lions throughout the district. It's ideal for old clubs to showcase their scrapbooks and club history for other Lions and community to see. Lots of entertainment, dancing, silent auction, raffle, and two other Districts participating. Don't miss our District's party of a century!

So You Think You Want To be a District Governor?



I was looking forward to this seminar when it got announced, but I was only able to attend when my holiday trip to Orlando, Florida, got cancelled due to a sickness in my travelling party. Like many

a PCL president before me, I have an interest in eventually serving as a District Governor. My prep timeline may require waiting until the International Convention is within a train or bus or car drive, as I don't particularly like being in high altitudes. It was made clear in our class that the DG gets installed at the International Convention, which often is in a location that requires air travel to get to it.

Leadership in Lions at the District level and quite often at the club level, is year to year. Annually, we need be thinking Who's Next? No matter how successful a given DG is, we will need to replace our current DG at the end of the Lion year. This class is good for our GLT / GMT team to offer because while the job does require a significant time and financial commitment, a Lion could properly plan and be to ready to serve in a few years. Our District needs members willing to serve as our District Governor.



Our teachers, GLT / GMT Coordinators PDG Mel Phillips, PCC Emil Kantola, PDG Ray Rosenthal, and VDGs Mario & Cindy gave an excellent insight into the financial and time commitments as well as other

incidentals like knowledge of rules, experience, diplomacy, fairness in decision making, not spreading gossip, spouse duties and expectations, etc. The DG role requires a 8 year commitment to the District as follows: 1 year for announcement & campaign, 2 years as VDG, 1 year as DG, 3 years as Convention Committee - Housing Chair, Registration Chair, Convention Chair, and 1 year as President of PDG's committee. The job during the ascension to DG will cost about \$11-12,000 a year at the minimum to cover a variety of commitments - club visitations, training, Lions events at various levels (club, District, MD4, LCI), providing room and board for invited peers from Council of Governors to our District events - Cabinet meetings and convention donations, travel expenses and the like. The class taught us that the job requires a significant time commitment, especially as DG. VDGs and DG serve on MD4 committees, are re-

quired to attend all COG meetings throughout the state.

One thought for aspiring District Governors to keep in mind, the more active you are in the District, serving on long term committees, serving in high profile roles where you lead Lions and clubs like Council president, GLT / GMT Trainer, Cabinet officer, the jump to District Governor will be much easier because you're already attending or serving many of the commitments that a VDG and DG need to make. Getting more involved in the MD4 and other out-of-District Lions events can help you be ready for the role. If you have external concerns like work and family or having to travel a lot, your timeline to be ready to serve may be longer than others. This class is ideal for those Lions who have interest and want to learn how best to prepare their timeline to be ready to serve as District Governor. Are you next? Are you ready?

For many years he was very involved in many Lions projects including the Palo Alto Concours d'Elegance, Lions Sight Day, and Lions Annual Glasses Collection; just to name a few.

In his professional life, he was a Palo Alto Firefighter for 31 years; rising to the rank of Assistant Fire Chief of the

department. He retired from active service in 1985 and went on to operate Lund, Pearson, and McLaughlin Fire Protection Service up to the time of his illness. Jim continued to be very involved in Fire Prevention and Code Development and served on many various committees at the State level.
